- Purpose of this handbook is to raise awareness and decolonize course curriculum






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
Structural Racism

- Opioid "epidemic" framed as a white problem
 - ► Treatment vs incarceration
- ► Rising Black/African American death rate largely ignored in political narratives
- Access to office-based treatments: White/Caucasian, suburban areas
- Restrictive treatments and jail/prison overutilized in minority populations
- ► There is a bias toward believing minorities are more likely to be substance abusers or they can endure more pain
- ► Historically and in recent decades, low-income and minority earners have had less access to medical care
- Overdose deaths are rising at higher rates among certain minorities such as
 Native American/Alaska Native and Black/African American

Buprenorphine Patients in US: 91% White, 56% College Educated




Any Opioid-Related Overdose ED Visits by Race/Ethnicity, 2019 Crude Rate per 100,000 Residents

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What does institutional racism look like in healthcare?


Black/African American & Latino/Hispanic patients with OUD are less likely to be referred to/receive treatment

Providers may not know the right questions to ask & how to ask them Assessing a person/patient based on your own cultural norms

Some patients of color report having to dress up and look nice so that they receive equal or better care in the ED

Pain is often under treated in ethnic/racial minority groups

What steps can hospitals take to engage communities of color?

- Celebrate diversity as an organization!
- Provide robust translation services
- Cultural competency training to all staff
- ► Hire a diverse workforce (staff, providers, leadership)
- ► Provide at the elbow support & expertise (Substance Use Navigator, Behavioral Evaluation and Addiction Management Nurse, champion, etc.)
- Review patient facing materials for cultural relevance
- Seek input from people with lived experience

Register for the 2020 Opioid Care Honor Roll Webinar Series!

In 2019, Cal Hospital Compare (CHC) launched the Opioid Care Honor Roll Program to help address the ongoing crisis. According to state data, nearly 2,200 Californians died of an opioid-related overdose in 2017. Patients with opioid use disorder are frequently hospitalized or visit the emergency department due to complications of the condition without also receiving treatment for the underlying disease of opioid addiction. This is a missed opportunity and leaves patients untreated and at high risk of future overdose. In this pilot year of the program, 60 hospitals voluntarily reported their progress on addressing the opioid crisis. While results show that all participating hospitals are making progress, it's
